Children's Commissioner (Dame Rachel de Souza) - A Guide for Parents on Managing Children's Digital Lives

Supporting children's safety is a shared responsibility between families, schools and wider society. For parents and carers, this responsibility has become increasingly complex as children's lives are now deeply intertwined with the digital world. Many parents face difficult decisions about how to balance protecting children from online harm with enabling access to spaces that are now central to learning, socialising and play. This guide was written with the direct involvement of children in England. It is a reflection of their views. My office visited schools to speak to teenagers, and spoke to my Youth Ambassadors and Youth Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) Panel to get their expertise on what works and what doesn't work between parents or carers and children in the 21st Century. Keep in the Know

Framwellgate Moor Neighbourhood Team will be proactively patrolling the local area, following an increase in vehicle thefts - thieves are specifically targeting Ford vehicles, primarily Ford Fiesta, Ford Focus and Ford EcoSport models. It is recommended to have layered security - use a steering or disc lock, a Faraday pouch/box for your key-less fob and consider installing a tracker system. Always remove your valuable belongings. It could be the difference between your vehicle being targeted or not. Keyless entry/ignition models of cars can be stolen without a key, making it considerably easier than many other cars on the market. It's advised to take extra steps to keep your vehicle safe from criminals and theft.
